Harry Connick Jr: A Celebration of Cole Porter will be performed without an intermission.



You've sung music by many of America's greatest composers. What makes Cole Porter particularly special to you?
Cole Porter is unique among composers of the American Songbook because he not only wrote the lyrics and the melodies, but he was also an orchestrator and an arranger. He was an incredible, complete musician—one of the few, actually, that had a comprehensive knowledge of music. His lyrics are beautifully poetic, and his melodies are perfect. Really, his work has everything: music, rhythm, harmony, poetry. It's the complete package.

Do you remember the first time you heard Porter's music?

I was probably in my early teens. My dad used to listen to radio stations in New Orleans that played songs from the American Songbook. I didn't really know who the composers were, but I remember hearing melodies that were beautiful and lyrics that were captivating, and those were usually songs by Cole Porter.

This is a show that you first presented on Broadway in 2019. What does it mean for

you to now revisit it on the Met stage? I've performed in venues all over the world, from tiny clubs in New Orleans to magnificent stages and huge outdoor venues. Performing at the Metropolitan Opera is something I've only dreamed about, because I'm not the type of performer who would ever typically be on this stage. The history here and the magnitude of this space are overwhelming. But that's what I live for. I'm so humbled to be able to pay tribute to Cole Porter on this stage. I think his music belongs right up there with all the great operas that have been performed here.

Of all the classic Porter songs on the program, is it possible to choose a favorite?

It's almost impossible to pick my favorite, but if I were to pick one, it may not be what you think it would be. I'm almost certain that it wouldn't be Cole Porter's favorite song either. It's "True Love." It's almost like a lullaby. It's so simple, but it's just so beautiful. And when I sing "True Love," I'm really thinking about him because my love for Cole Porter is as true as it gets.

About the Artists



Harry Connick, Jr.

Harry Connick, Jr.'s career has exemplified excellence across multiple platforms in the entertainment world. He has received Grammy and Emmy Awards, as well as Tony Award nominations, for his live and recorded musical performances, his achievements in film and television, and his appearances on Broadway as both an actor and a composer.

The foundation of Connick's art is the music of his native New Orleans, where he began performing as a pianist and vocalist at age five. Highlights of his music career include several multi-platinum albums (When Harry Met Sally, Blue Light, Red Light, When My Heart Finds Christmas, Come by

Me, and Only You). The Grammy-nominated True Love: A Celebration of Cole Porter was released in 2019 in conjunction with performances on Broadway. In 2020, as the world entered the pandemic lockdown, Connick retreated to his home studio and emerged with an album of songs of faith and inspiration. Alone with My Faith, released during the spring of 2021, displays the sheer breadth of Connick's talents as he wrote new songs, arranged all songs, played every instrument, and sang every voice. Alone with My Faith earned Connick his 16th career Grammy nomination for Best Roots Gospel Album.

Connick has appeared in 21 films and most recently starred in *Find Me Falling*, a romantic comedy filmed in Cyprus and released by Netflix in July 2024. Immediately upon release, *Find Me Falling* shot to the #1 English Language Film globally on Netflix. Connick has starred in *Dolphin Tale* with Morgan Freeman, *Hope Floats* with Sandra Bullock, *P.S. I Love You* with Hilary Swank, *Bug* with Ashley Judd, and *Copycat* with Sigourney Weaver, and on television (*American Idol, Will & Grace, South Pacific*, and his Emmy Award—winning concert specials). In December 2021, he stepped into the shoes of Oliver "Daddy" Warbucks in *Annie Live!*, which aired on NBC. In 2016, he launched *Harry*, a national daytime television show featuring his touring band, which earned 11 Daytime Emmy nominations in its two seasons, including two nominations for Best Host, and a Critics' Choice nomination for Best Talk Show.

On Broadway, Connick received Tony nominations as both a lead actor in *The Pajama Game* and as a composer/lyricist for *Thou Shalt Not*. He last performed on Broadway in December 2019 in *Harry Connick Jr: A Celebration of Cole Porter*.

Despite his busy career, Connick has always found the time to be charitable and has done some of his most important work in his efforts to help New Orleans after the devastation of Hurricane Katrina. He, along with friend Branford Marsalis, conceived of Musicians' Village and its centerpiece, the Ellis Marsalis Center.

Connick's honors—including a star on the celebrated Hollywood Walk of Fame as part of the 2019 class of honorees, induction into the Hollywood Bowl Hall of Fame, Honorary Doctorates from Tulane and Loyola Universities, and the Jefferson Award for Public Service—have not led him to slow his creative pace. They only confirm his determination to apply his talents in ways that prove inspirational to other artists and publicly spirited citizens.



Cole Porter

MUSIC AND LYRICS

Cole Porter was born in Peru, Indiana, in 1891. He attended Yale University, where his football songs are still popular. After the failure of his first Broadway show, he lived in Europe, where he met and married legendary beauty Linda Thomas. Returning to New York in the late 1920s, he gained renown for composing many of the greatest songs for stage and screen, among them "Night and Day," "You're the Top," "Begin the Beguine," and "I

Get a Kick Out of You." His 1930s were highlighted by such Broadway offerings as Anything Goes, Gay Divorce, and Jubilee. A crippling riding accident in 1937 left him in constant pain, yet he continued to write memorable scores, among them Can Can, Silk Stockings, High Society, and his masterpiece, Kiss Me, Kate. He died in California in 1964.

Luke Hawkins has toured with Harry Connick, Jr., to more than 40 cities, including Paris, London, and the Hollywood Bowl. He has also performed as a solo tap dancer at Carnegie Hall, as well as with six different orchestras: the National Philharmonic, America Pops Orchestra, Manhattan Symphonie, Omaha Symphony, Charlotte Symphony Orchestra, and West Virginia Symphony Orchestra.
